01 August

World Lung Cancer Day

Significance: World Lung Cancer Day is observed annually. The goal of Lung Cancer Day is to raise awareness about the risks, prevention, and early detection of lung cancer, while also providing support to those affected by the disease.

03 August

Friendship Day

The Quit India Movement

Significance: The Quit India Movement, also known as the Bharat Chhodo Andolan, was a civil disobedience movement launched by the Indian National Congress on August 8, 1942, during World War II, demanding an end to British rule in India. Mahatma Gandhi, a key leader of the movement, urged Indians to "Do or Die" to achieve independence. The movement was a significant turning point in the Indian independence struggle, demonstrating the widespread desire for self-rule and leading to the eventual withdrawal of British colonial power.

Quote: "Do or Die" (Karo Ya Maro)

09 August



Significance: Raksha Bandhan is one of the most popular and traditional Hindu festivals. The day celebrates the special bond between brothers and sisters. Also known as Rakhi, it is celebrated mostly in all parts of the country with different names, rituals, and cultural and historical significance.

Quote: "We may fight and tease each other, but our bond is unbreakable. Happy Rakhi!"

10 August



Significance: World Lion Day on August 10 is annually observed to celebrate the life of the 'King Of The Jungle'. The day was founded by the Big Cat Rescue team which was further joined by National Geographic Organisation. It serves as a reminder for people to act on the challenges faced by lions across the globe to maintain the ecological and cultural balance around the world.

Quote: "I am not afraid of an army of lions led by a sheep; I am afraid of an army of sheep led by a lion."

12 August

International Youth Day

Significance: International Youth Day celebrates the achievements of the young generation and honours the challenges they face. They are facing a number of challenges, including climate change, poverty, and inequality.

World Elephant Day



Significance: World Elephant Day is celebrated every year on August 12th to raise awareness about the plight of elephants and to advocate for their protection. The day was founded in 2012 by Patricia Sims and the Elephant Reintroduction Foundation of Thailand.

Quote: "The glory of the elderly is their insight, their knowledge, and their wisdom."


27 August
